He was an important and powerful leader. He was the president of the synagogue, a leader of the community. Synagogue leaders weren't supposed to ask for help. It was difficult for Jairus to ask for help from Jesus, but his daughter was dying, and he was desperate. This father would not hold on to pride. He would do whatever he needed to do. So he fell down in front of Jesus and pleaded with him. If he lost his job, then he would just have to accept that because he loved his daughter too much to hold onto pride. If they laughed because Jesus said he could bring her back to life, let them laugh. Jairus put his confidence in Jesus Christ.
